\*\*FY 2020 minimums were adjusted to 81% of original minimums and FY 2021 minimums were adjusted to 74% of original minimums due to COVID 19 restrictions.

\*\*\* In FY 2021, minimums were calculated based on regions which resulted in States in some regions having to sample a higher percentage of their breeding population. In FY 2022 this was changed so that all States sample the same percentage of their breeding population (0.4% to a maximum of 1,000 goats). In States where this resulted in an increase in the minimum for FY 2022, the increase was capped at 10% of the FY 2021 minimums. Since FY 2023 we are capping the increase at 10% over prior FY minimums or the actual number collected in the prior FY, whichever is greater.
